New compliance based law effective July 1, 2016, if one revocation &amp; DL re-instatement then mandatory interlock device 365 days, DUI 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense = 2 years. Last 120 days must be violation-free (tampering, circumventing, alcohol &gt; .02, removing, failure to appear for calibration appt.) or 120 days re-starts.</li> <li>b. THP CVE hiring two non-commissioned employees to assist with program.</li> <li>c. Next General Sessions Assembly to address “.02 or greater” verbiage change already in place for juveniles.</li> <li>d. 6,000 devices in effect statewide out of 23,000 annual DUI arrests</li> <li>e. New Restricted DL Form reviewed and already resulting in fewer Safety DL returns back to courts. Request home address updates if changes (as with DL).</li> <li>f. DUI Monitoring Fund - \$200 per device with % paid by fund</li> <li>g. Non-compliant drivers drive on revoked license until caught</li> <li>h. Program more effective if violator receives treatment</li> <li>i. Violator must show installation proof for DL re-instatement</li> <li>j. Some courts allow fines and court cost payment plans spanning over probationary periods allowing violators to apply for restricted licenses.</li> <li>k. ID's or DL's issued faster, process begins on violator release</li> <li>l. To request licensing of device providers at next legislative session</li> <li>m. Alternative facilities (vacant schools and office buildings) used for housing DUI offenders when jails at capacity. County contracts and monitoring questioned. Current Tennessee legislative prosecution issues; impairment burden of proof, subjectivity, Per Se limits, and drug tolerance. To pursue legislation changes when a person is on drugs with no prescription, lower BAC for alcohol if drugs or any schedule 1 drugs are present, and lower standards for prior DUI offenders.</li> <li>b. DRE Program training class early March in Chattanooga. Next class summer in Shelby County.</li> <li>c. Internal possession laws (CA and AZ)</li> <li>d. Law enforcement reports DRE's underutilized, dash camera poor video quality causing case dismissal, video download issues, and officers are not being believed. Anti-depressants and Xanax are not usually issues but cocaine and marijuana impairment are problems.
